



Studying began to get worse and many of us found ourselves buried in home-work.









Virginia Blood was crowned Cherry Pie Queen this year with Ruth Schmidt placing second.

With our families we went to church on Christmas morning to complete this most sacred and wonderful of all holidays.



FINALS DRAW NEAR




As finals draw near noises cease and study hall truly becomes a STUDY HALL.


Active in Mind


At least two of the girls will attend the State Convention in Grand Rapids this spring.










Youth . . . Active in Body
