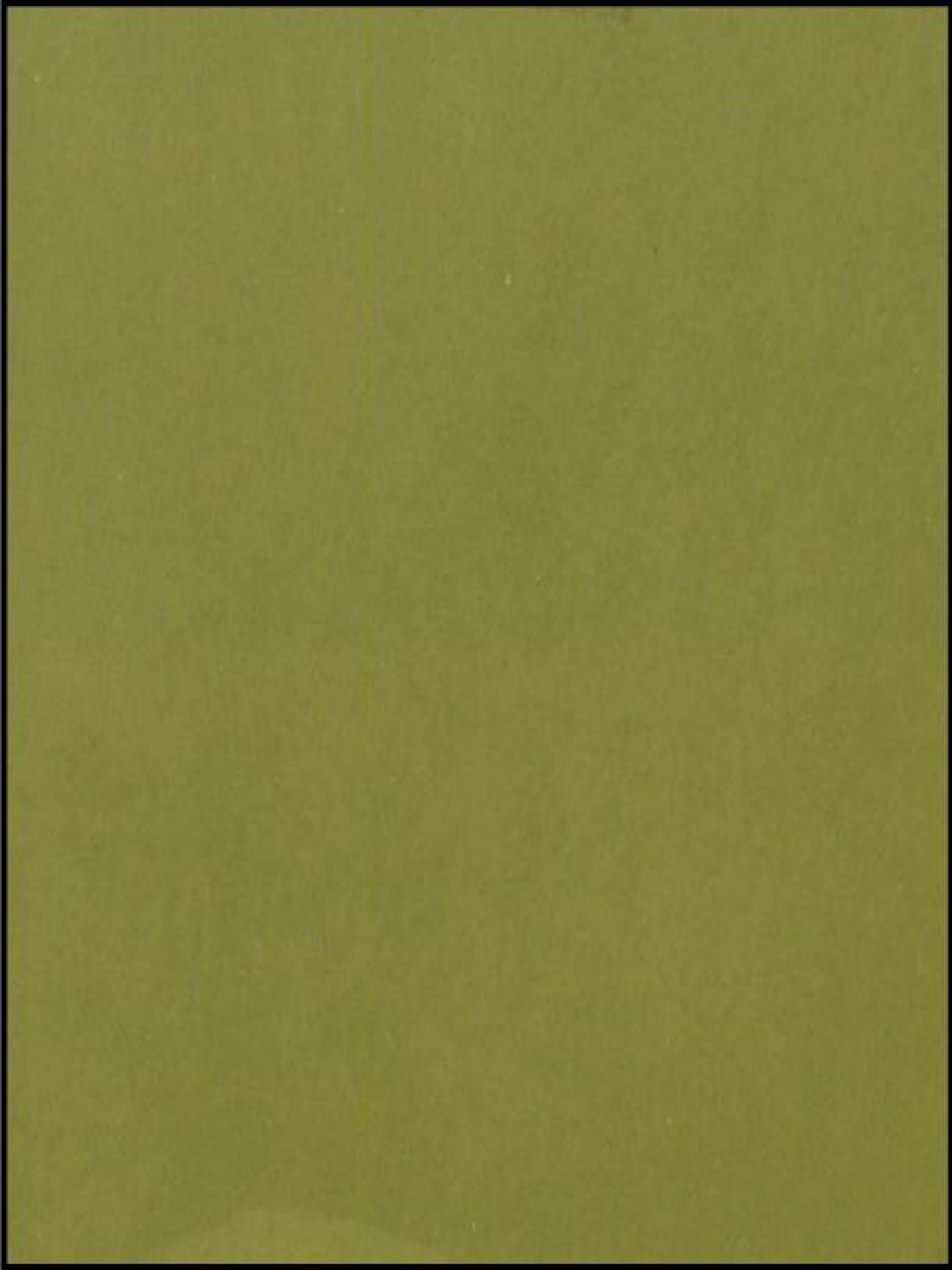
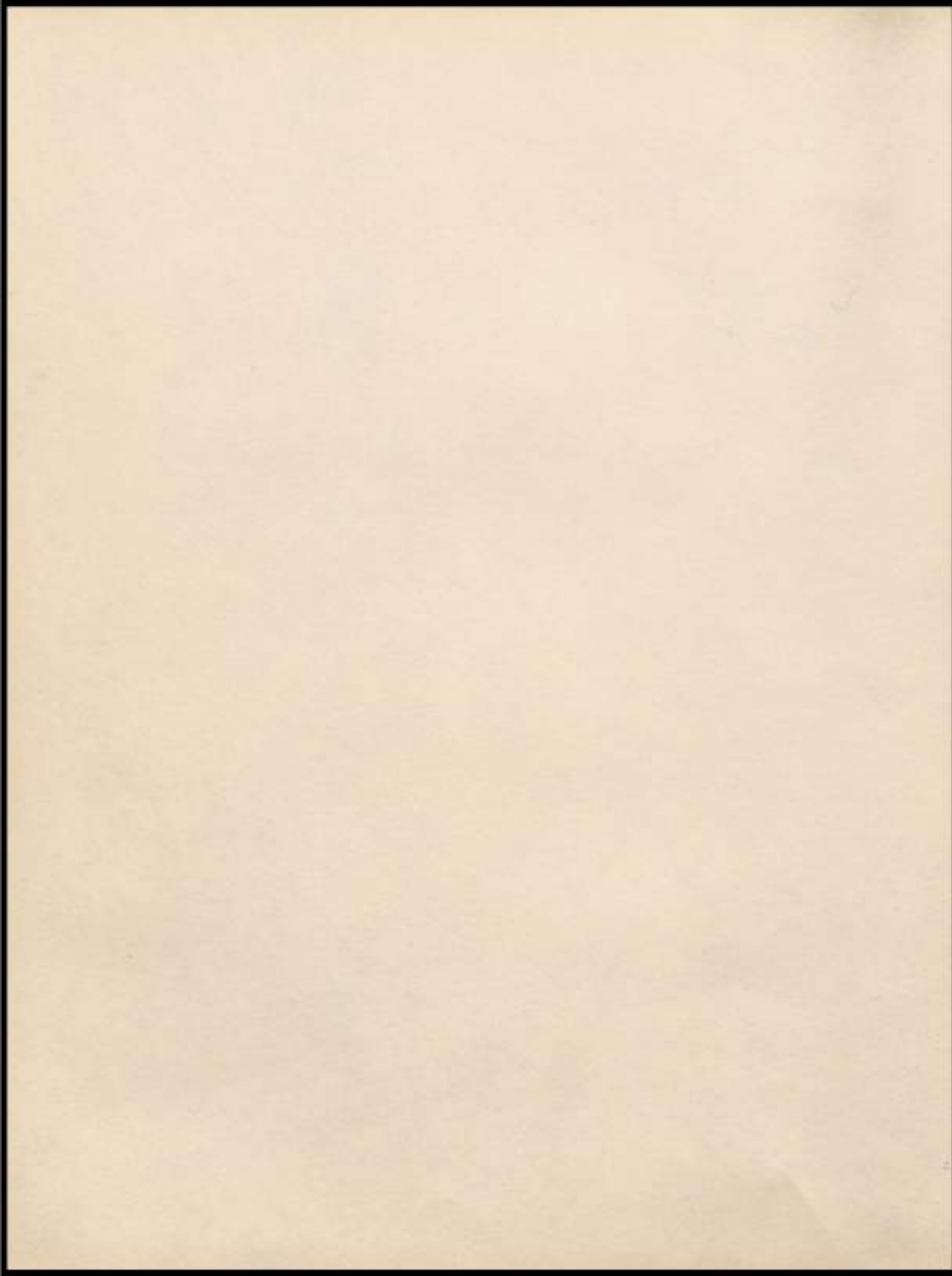

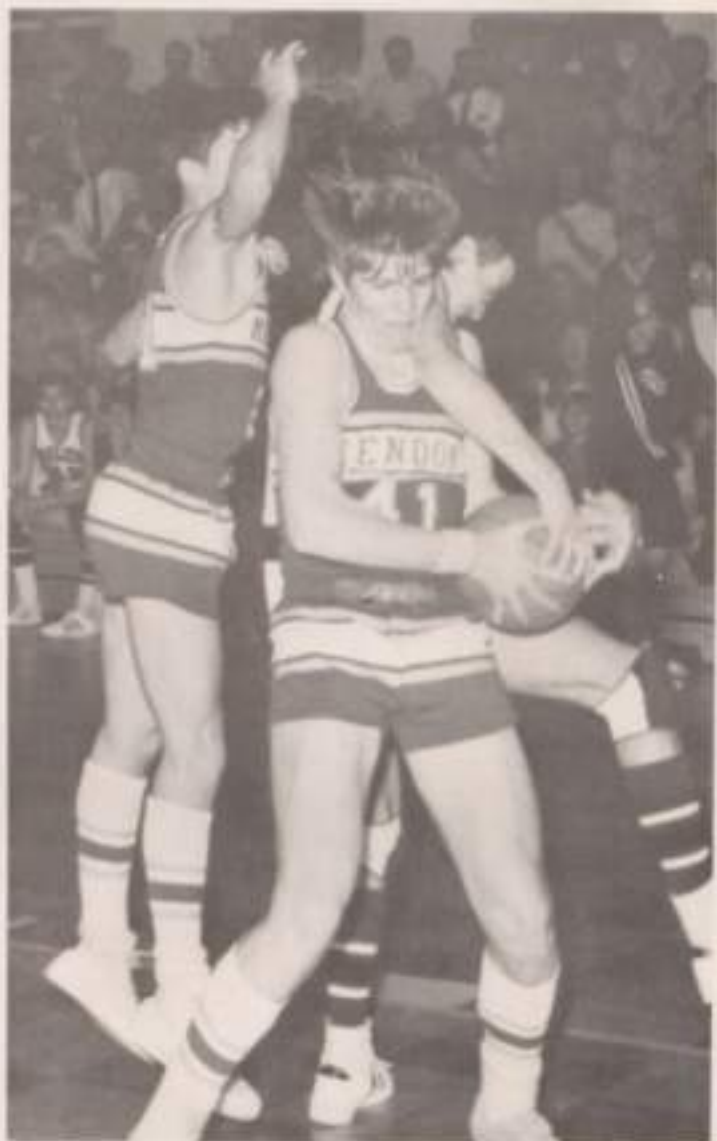

Eagerly awaiting to become Sophomores and obtain a jump in status, the class of '74 pushes forward.

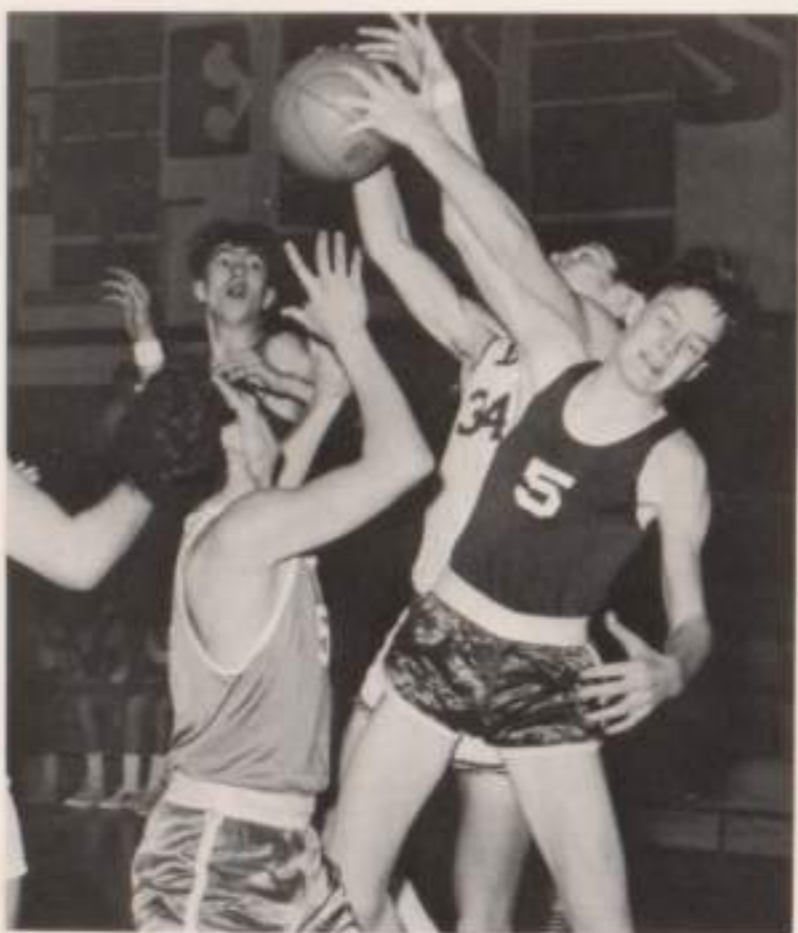

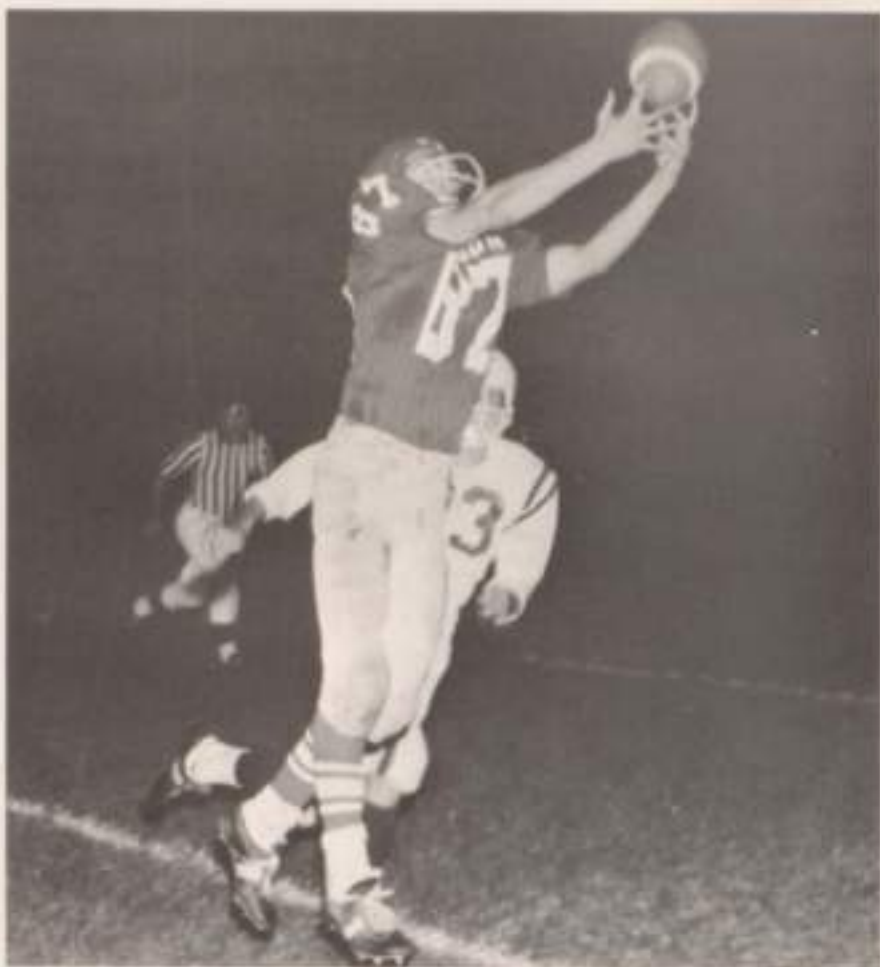

Their careful training and diligent practice under the direction of Coach Robert Critz proved to be worthwhile as the Mendon team finished a real good year.



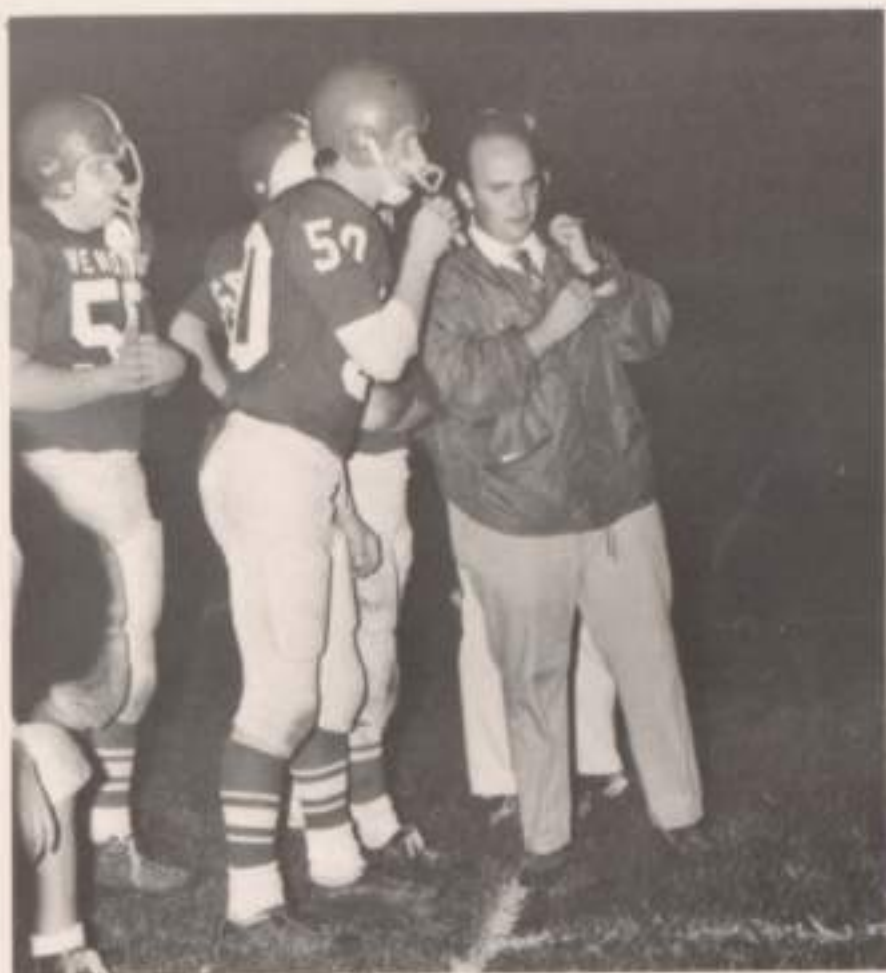

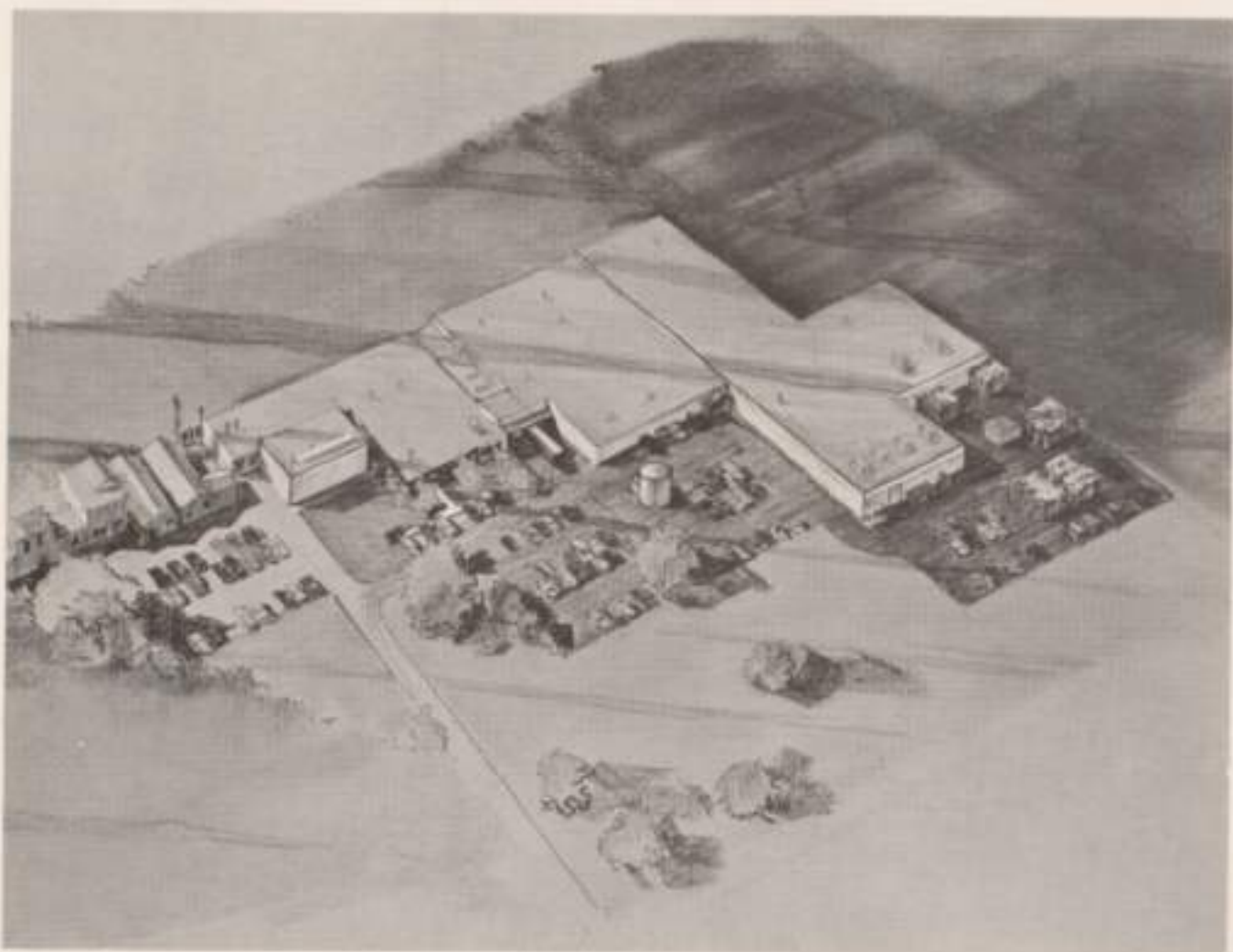
