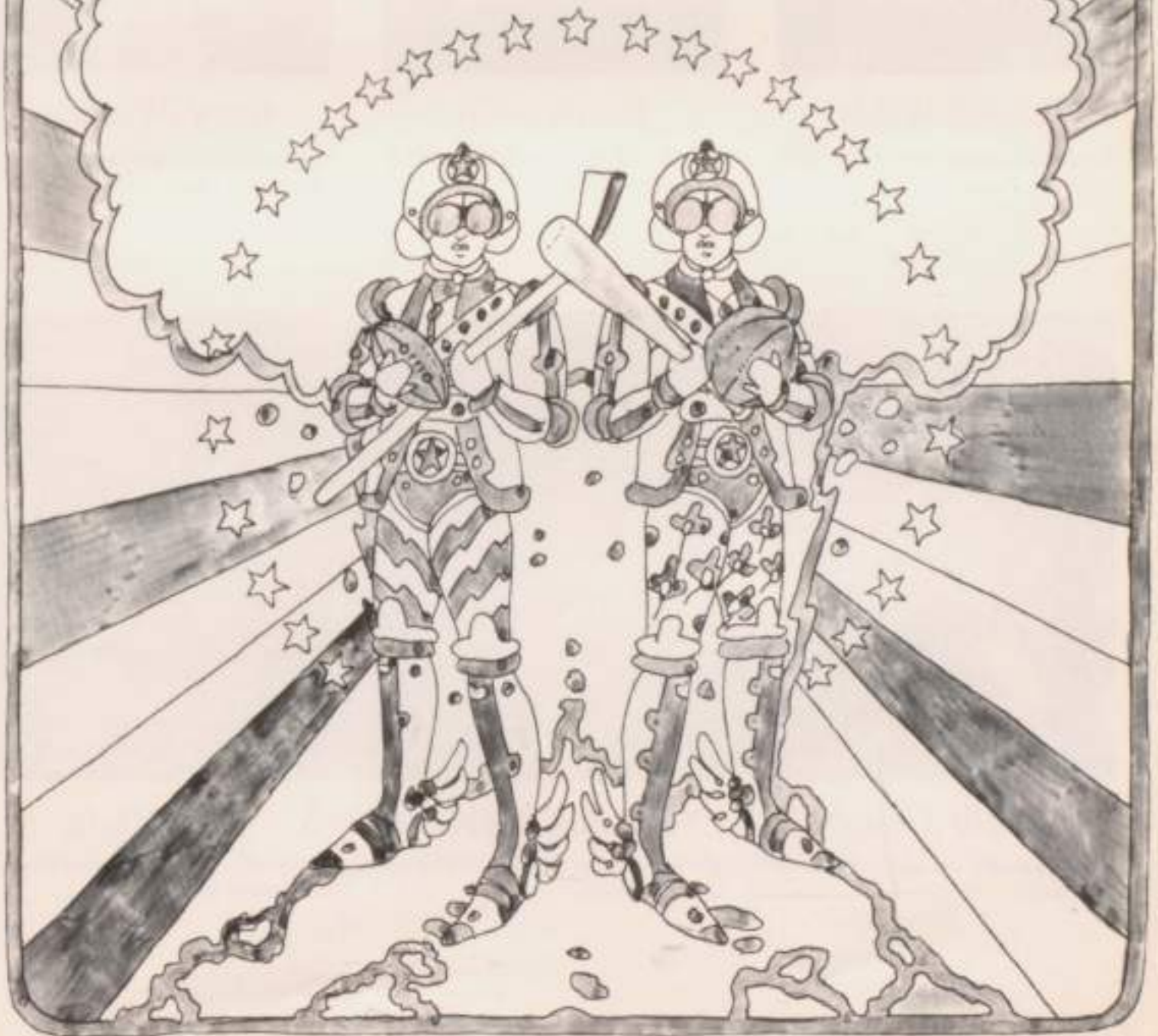


The Look of Love?

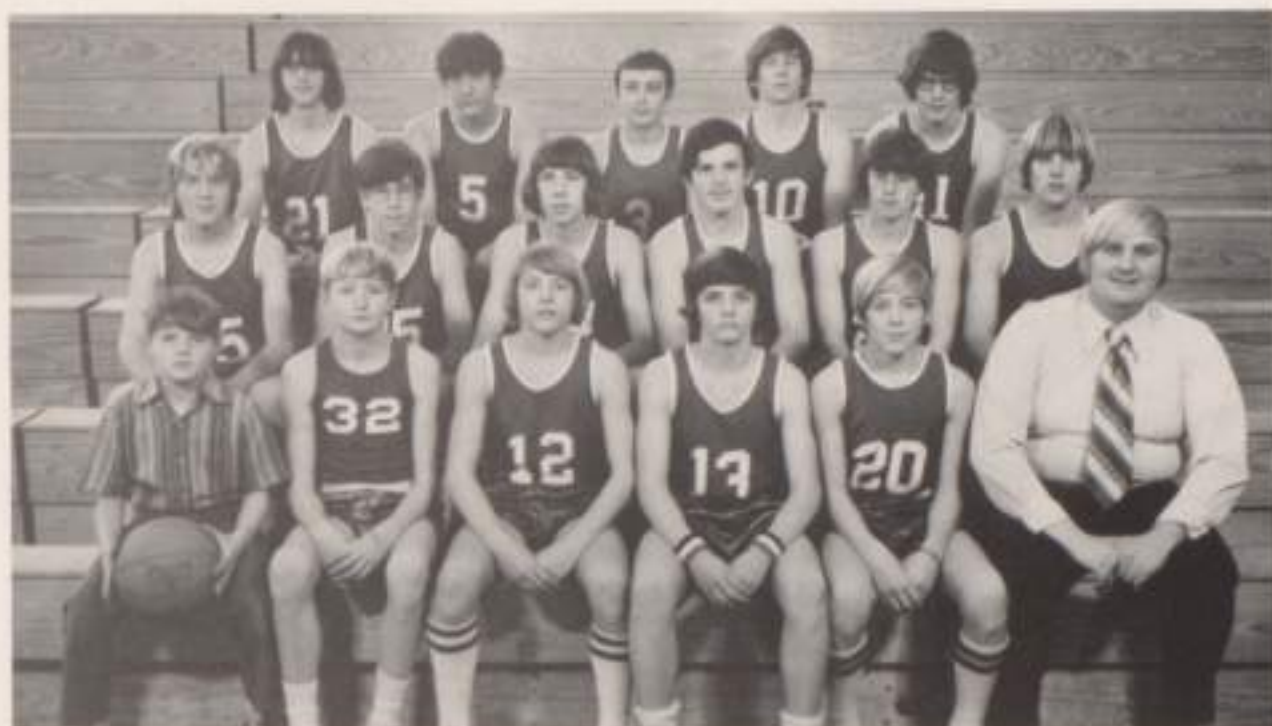
