Co-Captains of the team were Jill Cupp and Deb Tokarski.



lard was the teams rebounding force. Although the girls put in a lot of effort, they also had a lot of fun and folly during the season; but in the end they came out very victorious.







Mendon's Varsity Volleyball Team



Mendon, Michigan a



Two hundred years ago the lovely, fertile land, where Mendon township now rests, was part of large Nattawa-scepi Indian reservation. The first Frenchmen in the area discovered the land as they followed Indiam over the Chicago trail. In November of 1829, St. Joseph County was officially organized and opened up to white settlers.

In 1829 two French settlers by the name of Godfoi, came to the area to set up a small store and trading post on the shoets of the St. Joseph River. In 1831 Francaise Mauton traveled from Monroe, Mich. with his family to make a home in what is now Mendon. He took over the post belonging to the

Godfol hrothers.

Patrick Marantette arrived to the new settlement from Detroit in August of 1833. He was an educated strong young man of royal blood. He purchased the section of land on the St. Joe River which included the trading post. He eventually built the Marantette Manus on this beautiful for of land. By 1840 a number of French settlers followed Marantette and came to this scenic area to build new homes.

Mendon officially became a village in 1845. The first homes were built of simple logs. The first hotel was built in town in 1846. Mendon was on its way to becoming a fine settled village. Several of the downtowns buildings were destroyed by a fire in 1910. Most of the merchants were able to re-establish their stores. Some were lost forever. By 1911, the once French settlement had two hotels, three churches, a Carnegie library, which cost ten thousand dollars, and a brand new, beautiful school which cost twenty-five thousand dollars.

This small township sent its sons to fight in every war. The people of Mendon are proud of their history, proud of their people's accomplishments, and proud to be part of a Bicentennial town.



We got just what we need to help your family feed.

To keep us alive and to survive.

When one ponders over our nation's heritage over the past two-hundred years, one usually thinks of times when our forefathers strove to create a better life for future generations. Great events, inventions and inventors, of which we've heard since early childhood, have indeed contributed greatly to our present way of life. I would like to have seen the expression of Ben Franklin's face when he perfected his spectacles, or when Thomas Edison designed a practical lightfulb, or perhaps to witness Henry Ford's first automobile ride through town. These and countless other discoveries are things which we have come to take for granted in our daily lives. But I'd like to consider a seldom mentioned part of our heritage, a part which made all of these other things possible. This part is education.

Education in our country has not always been what it is today. In fact very few people received any education two-hundred years ago. But there were many dedicated people who contributed greatly to the growth of public education throughout our nation's existence.

During the years 1897 to 1907 our country underwent a period of vast industrialization and prosperity, and along with this came a need for better education. In earlier times the education of young people was considered to be an unnecessary institution, and was mainly a religious concern. Fortunately there appeared men and women who tecognized the need for better public education. Some not only saw the need, but dedicated much of their time to the cause. There were men like Thaddeus Stevens, a politician who gave many speeches of free education. Horace Mann gave up a promising career in politics to become secretary of the state board of

education. His wife Mary, along with her aister, Elizabeth Peahody, give much to the cause of education as school teachers. Advocates of higher education included James Mc-Cosh, president of Harvard, and many others.

In the early eighteen hundreds, states started to require the development of public schools and also the attendance of all children. By 1900 all but two states, excluding the South, had made schooling for all children compulsory.

Education had achieved great advancements, but there were still improvements to be made. Most children received an average of only five years of school, and the rural one room school bouses were often inadequate. With the great increase in the number of public high schools also.

The development of many schools had been made pessible by federal land grants. As far back as the land ordinance of 1785 and 1787, land was being set aside for the building of schools. In 1862 the Morrill act was passed which granted each state thirty thousand acres of land for each member it had in the house of representatives. There were also lands given for the expressed purpose of developing colleges.

The development of education was a necessary part in the growth of our country. Now as we are in the midst of the celebration of our nations bicentennial, one can consider the educational opportunities available to us today, and really appreciate the efforts of those who strove to make these opportunities possible. When we consider how far we've come in the institution of education we know we mally have something to celebrate about on our country's two-hundredth birthday.

experienced so many times with other graduating classes was now over for us.




