












Time Capsule Captures Memories

Varsity Football Takes Revenge!!!

In '94, the Mendon Hornets Football team suffered many painful losses. So throughout the summer, the whole team worked out thinking about the year ahead. The '95 Hornets featured twelve seniors, six juniors and two sophomores who were already ranked number one in the state. The word for this years' team was RE-VENGE. The Hornets started an explosion in Galien by winning dominantly (47-0), and continued winning throughout the regular season, grabbing a share of the SJV crown. Along the way the Hornets went 8-1, avenging last year's losses to White Pigeon (43-0) and Constantine (21-8). The only loss came at Schoolcraft where the Green and White dropped a tough defensive struggle to the Eagles (7-6). The Hornets were selected as the Class D area team and went into the playoffs ranked 2nd in the state, behind Lake Linden Hubbel.

In the playoffs, Pittsford came to Mendon with an unbeaten record. a conference championship and a number five ranking. The Wildcats showed no respect for the Hornets or the SJV, so the Green Machine sent 'em home with a reason to respect both, a 62-0 embarrassment. The playoff road then led to Lawrence and the game known simply as the "Snow-Bowl." The Hornets pulled out a slim victory (18-14). In the Semi-Finals, the Hornets found the re-match they had worked for all summer - against Waterford.

The Lakers had ended the Hornet's season a game early the previous year, and once again the team turned to the familiar theme of revenge. On a muddy field, the "Gators" took the 14-7 victory in a tightly contested battle. The Hornets were on their way to their second home again. In the Dome, the Hornets faced a familiar opponent, Lake Linden Hubbel for the third time in four trips. Once again, the Green and White was victorious (19-8). The Hornets brought home the State Crown to add to those from '69, '72, '82, '89, '91, and '93. Although twelve seniors graduated, there is a wealth of talent and coaching, and the "Gators" are expected to dominate for years to come.
